COMNAP

The study of Antarctica, the Southern Ocean, and their role in the Earth system, has never been more important than it is today. The region is experiencing changes that are global in scope, making it a rich laboratory for transformational research, important in its own right and impossible to achieve elsewhere on the planet. The **Scientific Committee on Antarctic Research** is an interdisciplinary committee of the International Council for Science, charged with initiating, developing, and coordinating international scientific research in the Antarctic region. The **Council of Managers of National Antarctic Programs** is an international association of the National Antarctic Programs from 28 Antarctic Treaty countries, which develops and promotes best practice in managing the support of scientific research in Antarctica.

Portland is a vibrant, accessible city with a strong environmental stewardship ethic. Our universities, government agencies, and private sector are all recognized for their commitment to and innovation in sustainable practices and development.

Both Portland State University and the conference hotel are located in the heart of the city, with convenient public transportation connections to Portland International Airport and city attractions. A variety of extramural activities are planned and will be announced via the conference website.

Located at the confluence of the Willamette and Columbia Rivers in northwest Oregon, Portland is a gateway to outdoor adventures for all ages and appetites. July is prime time in Oregon: the days are mild, evenings are cool, and our skies are clear. We hope you will have the chance to explore some of what Oregon has to offer while you are here.

SCAR Standing Scientific Group and subsidiary group meetings, and the Open Science Conference will all be held at the conference hotel, the Hilton Portland (921 SW Sixth Avenue). Portland State University will host the COMNAP Symposium, COMNAP AGM, and SCAR Delegates meetings on its campus, about a 10 minute walk from the conference hotel.

A block of rooms has been reserved at the conference hotel at 169 USD plus local taxes and fees, per night. A limited number of University rooms will be available at 25 USD, plus taxes and fees, per person (double occupancy required) for participants with demonstrable economic need.
